The tutor will plan, deliver and assess learning in a flexible and responsive way, ensuring alignment with Curriculum for Excellence and Qualification Scotland requirements, while prioritising person-centred planning and pupil voice.

Key Responsibilities

- Deliver tailored 1:1 and small group Home Economics tuition, adapting approaches to meet diverse additional support needs
- Plan learning in line with Curriculum for Excellence and Qualification Scotland frameworks, ensuring progression and relevance
- Deliver engaging, practical learning experiences, including food preparation, nutrition and independent living skills
- Develop and implement individualised learning plans, tracking learner progress using a range of assessment approaches
- Differentiate teaching to support learners with neurodiversity, communication differences and complex needs
- Promote the development of life skills, health and wellbeing, and independence
